It is our responsibility to engage families as a partner in educational choices. As a founding school, there are opportunities not only for family engagement, but family empowerment.

Providing students with the skills, knowledge, and attitude that they need to be prepared for college and beyond is amiss if the school does not also support families in developing the skills, knowledge, and attitude that they need to support their student on that journey.

LP is committed to building a strong parent and family-school partnership. Legacy Prep promotes and encourages parents and families and school personnel to be involved in all aspects of their child's education to include:

- Parent Communication: A communication is sent home every Thursday to every parent for upcoming events; newsletter; Legacy Prep Yearly Calendar of events; Legacy Prep website; teacher emails and phone calls; school-wide communication platform used for instant communication through apps, texts, and email.
- Home Visits: Before scholars start at Legacy Prep, a staff member will visit each family to review the commitment to excellence, to learn information about each scholar, and to discuss their hopes, dreams, and needs.
- Parent and Family Orientation: Before students start school, Legacy Prep will host an orientation where families will get a hands-on, intensive "Day in the Life" of a Legacy Prep student.

- Open House: Before students start school, Legacy Prep will host an Open House where families and students can see the school, casually meet teachers, and prepare for day one.
- Student-Led Conferences: Through these conferences, students begin to take responsibility for their academics and to understand that grades are earned and academic progress takes effort. The process also helps students to better understand themselves as learners, to identify patterns and habits associated with success and struggle, and to develop and adopt strategies for future success. Ultimately, the student-led-conference process empowers students to be in control of their own progress and goal attainment, and to advocate for themselves as learners.

Legacy Prep provides financial and technical assistance to support parent and family engagement plans including a variety of workshops (i.e., technology, reading and math strategies, student assessment, discipline, etc.)

The results of the surveys will be used to develop strategies for school improvement and to make any necessary revisions to the Parent and Family Engagement Plan and policies. Areas evaluated include: Academics and School Leadership, Parent Involvement, Title I, School Environment, Parent and Family Engagement Program, and overall family satisfaction.

Legacy Prep will have a Family Advisory Leadership Council (FALC). Families will be the driver of this organization, with a member of the leadership team supporting. Events may include, but are not limited to:

- FALC Workshops: Family members will be encouraged to present their expertise to other family members. Topics could include: planning for college, community service, etc.
- FALC Fundraisers: Change-for-Change, coupon books, etc.
- FALC Events: Dance-a-Thon, Kindergarten "prom" Family Movie Night, Cuddle up and Read, etc.

The focus of Legacy Prep's Parent and Family Engagement Policy is to involve parents and families in the educational process of their child through professional development, communication, school activities, and volunteer programs.

Goals and progress will be communicated to the stakeholders through the Family Advisory Leadership Council meetings, local school staff meetings, newsletters, emails, and the local media so there is a shared commitment for a quality education for all students attending Legacy Prep.

Parents will be notified of their child's academic progress through progress reports, parent conferences, student work samples, report cards (sent home every trimester), teacher conferences/contacts (throughout the year), and RTI/504/IEP meetings.

Parents will receive results of individual student assessments and the interpretation of those results, through dissemination as they become available from the state for standardized assessments and periodically for system-level assessments.

Legacy Prep will ensure that consistent and effective communication regarding student performance is in place with all parents. K-5 teachers will send home weekly folders to parents for communication and student work; provide materials and training to help parents assist their child in improvement of academic achievement; provide parents training on literacy, math, social and emotional learning, mental health, etc.

Legacy Prep will provide professional development for staff members to help strengthen their skills in working with parents and the Daniel Payne community. Parents will be able to attend training sessions via our Family Advisory Leadership Council meetings. The advisory meetings focus on a variety of subjects to include training on core curricular subjects, study skills, technology, student assessment strategies, interpretation of student assessment data and successful parenting techniques.

- In partnership with The Boys and Girls Club of America, they provided enrichment opportunities for participating students
- FALC and the school share information back-and-forth between LP and the community.

Legacy Prep strives to ensure that information related to school and parent programs, meetings and activities are available to all parents in an understandable and coherent format. A school-wide calendar of events with information is sent home at the beginning of the year and available on the website throughout the year.

Publications and other communication will be translated into scholars' home language when and if needed. Legacy Prep provides program information to parents in a variety of methods: parent notices, weekly Thursday newsletters, brochures, flyers, news releases, posters, website.

Legacy Prep will support parents through the Family Advisory Leadership Council to identify, fund and execute other activities that keep parents informed and engaged.

Legacy Prep will involve parents in the planning, review, and improvement of programs under Title I, which explains how the school will require components of a quality education program for all students. Surveys will be conducted to gather data regarding various aspects of development of training for teachers, principals, and other educators to improve the effectiveness of such training.

A comprehensive needs assessment will be conducted and objectives based on the results of the assessment will be developed. A plan of action will be developed that is clear, concise, and specific to result in quality education for all participating scholars. The plan will be shared, understood and implemented by the entire school community. Parents will be involved in developing a plan that involves:

- A rigorous and relevant curriculum that is aligned with state standards, project based learning, and personalized instruction for all scholars
- Effective and research based instructional methods
- Timely and effective interventions for scholars who are having difficulty mastering academic standards
- Teachers who are receiving high-quality, ongoing professional development to enable every scholar to meet and or exceed the state standards

Legacy Prep may utilize funding from this part for literacy training for parents as needed if local fund sources, along with any other reasonable sources, have been exhausted.

The Title I Committee and the Family Advisory Leadership Council encourages parents to participate in activities such as: Thanksgiving Lunch, Field trips, Field Day Activities, etc. Parents will be trained to lead professional development for other parents to enhance the involvement of other parents in the implementation of some activities.

This could include helping with classroom projects and special activities, helping with fundraisers, serving as chaperones on field trips, and assisting with classroom parties.

Legacy Prep will conduct an annual Title I meeting for parents to provide suggestions regarding how parent engagement funds will be used. In the elementary grades, teachers send home weekly folders with pertinent information for parents. School administration sends out a weekly newsletter via email every Thursday to all parents. Teachers will conduct conferences with parents during each trimester.

To offer flexibility for parent conferences, parents who are unable to attend the parent conferences are offered phone or video conferences. An annual parent survey will be sent out in the fall and spring to identify the needs of parents. This data will be evaluated and will be used to offer meetings regarding those topics from the Family Advisory Leadership Council. Legacy Prep contacts parents in a variety of ways for important meetings and events through email, phone calls, newsletters, Facebook, and our school website.

Through the guidance of the Family Advisory Leadership Council (FALC), Legacy Prep will conduct and implement strategies for parents to share glows (positives), areas of growth, and

other expectations. Information regarding the curricular expectations and requirements will be shared with parents during registration and Open House.

Legacy Prep has a Title I Committee which provides parent and family engagement strategies related to Title I and the Family and Community Engagement Plan.
